Perhaps the most important opportunity for them is the chance to learn more about themselves and the place they hold in the story that is unfolding at St. Angela.

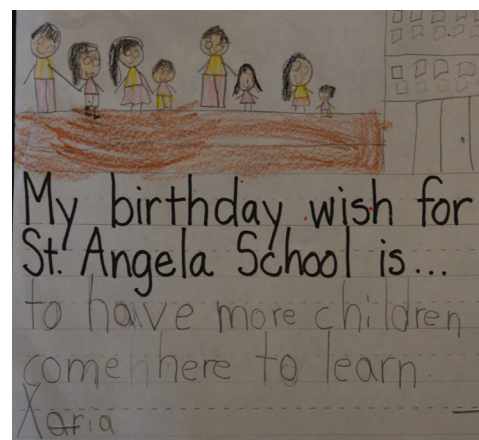
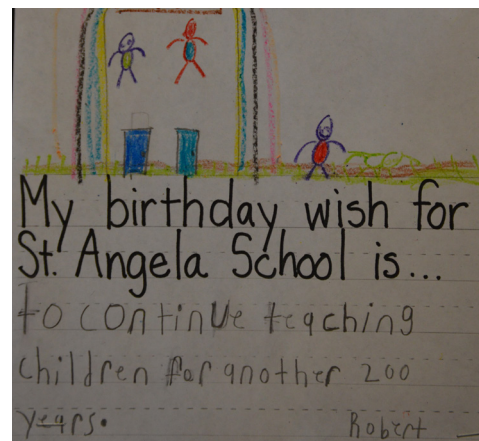
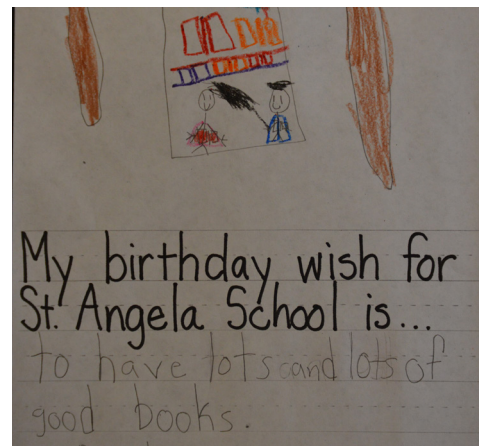
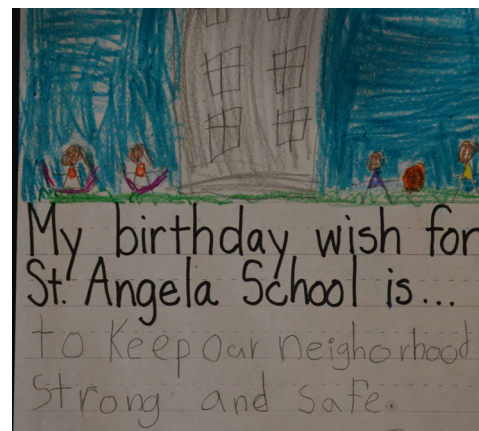

Big Shoulders Fund & Archdiocese of Chicago

The St. Angela School community is very fortunate to enjoy significant financial support from the donors of the Big Shoulders Fund, and both financial and administrative support from the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Big Shoulders provides scholarship assistance for individual scholars, funds St. Angela's involvement in particular curricular and co-curricular programs, such as the student newspaper, and the Young Entrepreneurs Club, and helps with restricted projects such as campus improvements. The Wyoming summer trip to Brush Creek Ranch is a Big Shoulders initiative, one that provides science enrichment and team building for a group of O'Rourke Prep (junior high) scholars.

St. Angela relies on OCS for administrative guidance, financial support, and the oversight that is generally provided by a school district. The partnership with OCS is an important one for school operations. In the last two years, however, OCS has been even more helpful as we faced two major capital projects, the replacement of the boiler tank, and the tuckpointing of the south wall of the school.

Because funds from Big Shoulders and OCS are not recorded as income by our Advancement Office, those contributions are not reported here but they are an enormous part of the success of St. Angela School and we are deeply grateful for their support.

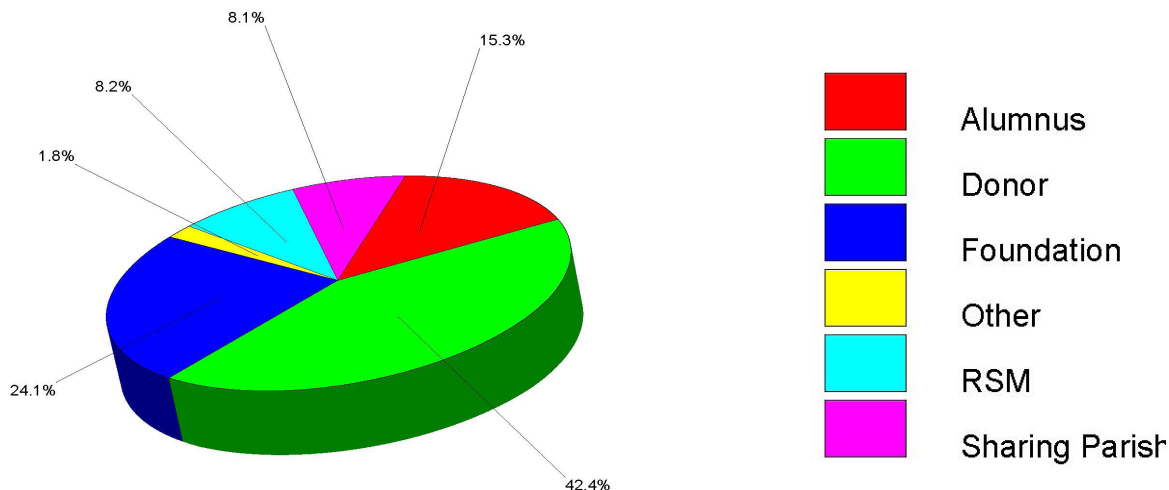

Gift & donor data

- **Total gifts between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019: \$429,925.**
- **Of that total, \$103,500 came from granting institutions.** *Grant receipts account for the single biggest change in advancement income from one year to the next.*
- **The single largest solicitation of the year is the appeal which donors receive late fall. In Fiscal Year 2019 the appeal raised \$135,929.** *This is approximately the annual return for the appeal.*
- **In FY2019 we received \$86,445 in unsolicited gifts.** *These came as memorial gifts and gifts made online, and include gifts from those donors who make monthly or quarterly donations.*
- **We have a database with names of 8,281 constituents; we have addresses for 4,220 of them.**
- **We have 6,314 constituents who are identified as alumni, although we don't always have a class year for them. We have addresses for 2,398. Of those, 8% (190) contributed to St. Angela in FY2019.** *How does this compare to other schools? It is actually a pretty good percentage for alumni giving; ten percent is a goal not often reached by even the most robust giving programs.*
- **Eighty-four donors made their first gift to St. Angela in the fiscal year (FY19) on which we are reporting.** *Those gifts totaled \$18,863.*
- **Ninety-three donors have supported St. Angela for ten or more years.** *Their gifts total \$1,775,752 since they began to support our ministry in Austin. Our records go back to 2008; we know that people have been giving to our school for longer than that!*

Where do our gifts come from?



Nearly half of our funding income (42.2%) in FY2019 was from “Donors.” They are listed simply as that, without any additional designation. We suspect some of them, perhaps many of them, are alumni, but we don’t have the complete school records that are a blessing to an advancement office so we can’t cross-reference them against class lists.

The next category is Foundations. Gifts from foundations, or grants, accounted for nearly one-quarter of the income we raised in the advancement office in the last fiscal year. We receive grant income from several granting agencies annually but not automatically. The Sisters of Mercy Midwest, and Mission and Ministry, an outreach of the Daughters of Charity, contribute generously to our operating budget.

Alumni contributed 15.3% of St. Angela’s charitable income. Again, this 15.3% is from donors for whom we have alumni information. Many alumni gifts are specially directed to programs of the donors choosing. We have many consistent donors to the Jack & Marty Jordan Fund and alumni contributed generously to our Green Dreams initiative of the last two years.

Nearly tied at 8.1 and 8.2% are gifts from individual Sisters of Mercy and from our sharing parish, St. Mary of Vernon. The Sisters of Mercy, both the order and the individual sisters of the Chicago area, retain a strong bond with St. Angela. The people of St. Mary of Vernon are good friends and generous supporters of St. Angela!

And where do they go?

When we look at gifts to St. Angela from the perspective of “purpose” the two largest are for **restricted** (those designated by donor in response to a request) and **unrestricted gifts** (those given without any designation so to be applied to the best use of the school.)

Restricted gifts include special projects, or particular aspects of the operating budget: curriculum enhancement for example. They help us advance programs while maintaining a good balance with our operating budget.

Unrestricted gifts (those which come in without designation by the donor) are the lifeblood of our school. These are the gifts that benefit the operating budget: they help us provide tuition assistance; they help us pay salaries and bills; and they fill the “gap” between the actual cost of educating a child and the tuition we receive from school parents.

Gifts of any size, and directed to assist with any of our stated needs, are deeply appreciated. Your partnership is the key to our success. Thank you!

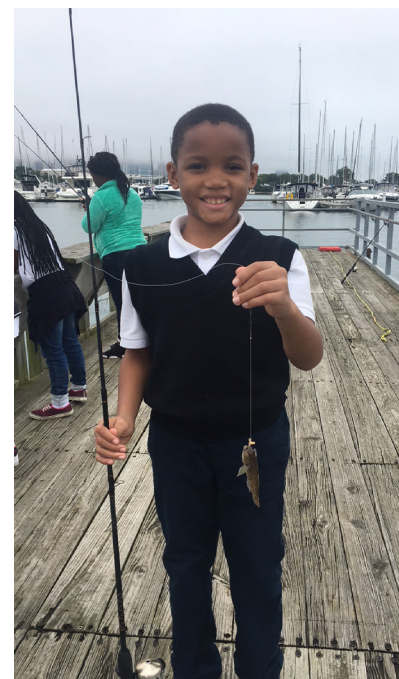
